

With time, the challenge for this generation of believers became apparent: acknowledging that their Christian faith has more to offer than a list of spiritual chores and guaranteeing a spot in heaven. They began to understand that the kingdom was more within reach than they once thought. An intimate relationship with God permits the present-day experience of His kingdom and His intentions for our lives are not restricted to salvation. Christian Boomers came to desire experiences with God in their daily lives, as ordinary as they may have seemed. These newfound realizations challenged them to move beyond the facts of God to the experience of Him."



Scripture tells us that the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith, but what if transitioning from faith to faith was never meant to be a solo endeavor?
